LATEST NEWS ON THE LAMBERT

Fundraising for the appeal to open a new hospice and community hub at the former Lambert Memorial Hospital in Thirsk continues with some wonderful recent donations.

Highlights include over £18,000 from a Ball at Thirsk Barns and £15,000 from local fundraisers who arranged an evening of magic. Thirsk Doctors' surgery raised over £3,000 from a bingo night and raffle. Peter Wright, from The Yorkshire Vet has hosted a Tractor Run and is also planning a coast to coast cycle ride later this year.

Got a garden to be proud of? We're inviting green-fingered supporters to help us grow funds by holding an open garden event for us this spring or summer.



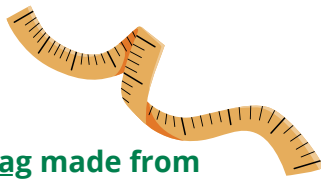

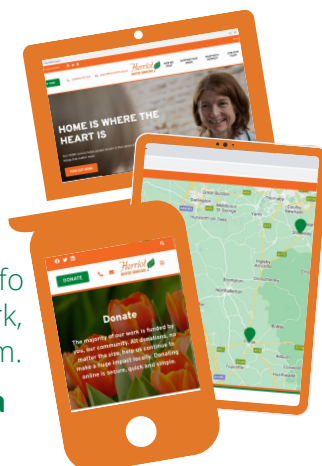
