With Herriot's vital support, Colin Sibley was able to stay at home where he was most comfortable during the last 11 weeks of his life before he died from prostate cancer. Colin's wife Judith shares her memories...

"Colin was a man who never drew the circle of his family and friends too small; a down to earth Yorkshireman - always ready to lend a helping hand when and where it was needed.

"Having been first diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2015, Colin had a variety of treatments over the years, and it was something that was lived with, as opposed to living in its shadow.

"The Herriot team were there to support Colin and myself (and the rest of the family) with his care for the last 11 weeks of his life.

"Fantastic care was given throughout; Colin's smiles showed how much he felt about all you did for him.

"You taught me such a lot which helped me to be a better carer for him, especially during the nights and you were a great support to me, as well as to Colin.

"You are all angels - very dedicated to what you do. Your care, compassion and friendliness were very special to us both. I really can't praise you enough."

She currently supports four people living with a terminal illness and their carers, across a wide geographical area in Hambleton and Richmondshire.

Her visits provide them with some meaningful social activity, whilst also providing carers with a much-needed break from their responsibilities.

She gets to know each person and tailors activities to their needs – such as doing some light weeding for a garden lover, while they sit and enjoy their garden.

Other people might like a drive in the countryside, a game of chess, or just a chat over a cuppa at home.

Christine says: "I like the carers to be able to go out and have some time to themselves, while I spend time with their loved one. One person goes to the gym while I go out for a walk or drive with their partner.

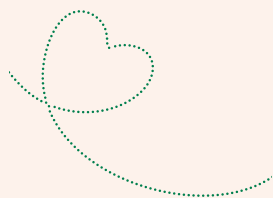
"Other carers might go to the hairdressers, or enjoy the chance to meet a friend for lunch."

If you're worried about someone close to you gambling, we can give you the support you need, and also help you to support them to reduce gambling harms.

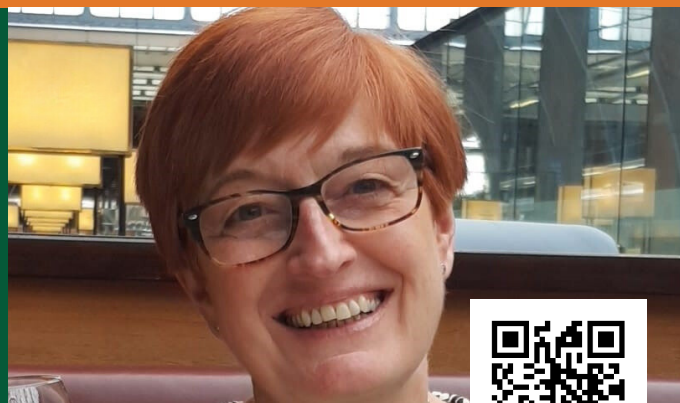

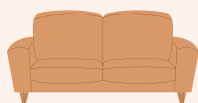
